The Heartland Environmental Justice Center (HEJC) at Wichita State University helps individuals, organizations, and institutions who serve underserved and disadvantaged communities in Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, Nebraska, and adjoining Indigenous nations capitalize on their capacity to make meaningful advances towards environmental and energy equity at the local, state, regional, and federal levels.

HEJC operates first as listener to underserved communities who have historically and systematically been disproportionately impacted by environmental, energy, climate, and public health adversities.

The EPA defines EJ as...

the fair treatment and meaningful involvement of all people regardless of race, color, national origin, or income, with respect to the development, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies.

What about Energy Justice?

"Energy justice refers to the goal of achieving equity in both the social and economic participation in the energy system, while also remediating social, economic, and health burdens on those disproportionately harmed by the energy system... Energy justice aims to make energy accessible, affordable, clean, and democratically managed for all communities."

Including public-private partnerships and innovative financing structures, to pursue clean energy demonstration, deployment, workforce development, and outreach projects that meet energy justice needs






