## **Texas Economic Highlights**



 Texas reached a new high for civilian labor force, now at more than 15.7 million.



- Texas led the nation for jobs added over the last 12 months, as of March 2025.
- State sales tax revenue totaled **\$4 billion** in October, 5.4% higher than the same month last year.



• In February 2025, Texas exports totaled approximately \$36.5 billion.
